

Fernanda Mascarenhas is an artisan, textile artist, natural dyer, performer and graphic designer, born and raised in São Paulo, Brazil. She lives in New Westminster, BC, since September 2022.

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Fernanda began her artistic journey through the dance. After graduating at the University, she started working as a graphic designer with expertise in books, publications and exhibitions. At the same time, Fernanda cultivated her artistic career as an interdisciplinary performer, participating in dance and theatre projects. In 2007, she joined as a performer in the Fu Bu Myo In group directed by Toshi Tanaka, a Japanese performer and teacher. Together with the group for over 12 years, she has researched body, voice, costume and scenic elements through seitai-ho, a set of Japanese body techniques, and through the traditional Noh theatre. This enduring experience consolidated her career as a performer.

In 2016, Fernanda began her research in natural dyeing to develop the costumes of her performance Each Step. This costume won an award, which allowed the artist to travel to Japan in 2017 to learn more about traditional forms of natural dyeing and weaving, besides knowing her teacher's seitai-ho masters. There, the artist visited the Ars Shimura School of the "Living National Treasure" textile artist Fukumi Shimura in Kyoto, the Little Indigo Museum of textile artist Hiroyuki Shindo in Miyama, and the Japanese Botanical Garden of Dyeing Plants in Takasaki. She also attended classes with the seitai-ho master Masanori Sasaki in Tokyo, and with Kazuhiro Sunami (Seitai Association/Physical Education Research Institute) in Kyoto.

Since then, Fernanda has focused on textile art emphasizing the ancient techniques of natural dyeing with plants. Although her great inspiration comes from the Japanese culture, the Brazilian plants of her surroundings have been the main material and passion. Nowadays, she is researching the Canadian dye plants by herself, and attending workshops at Earthand Gleaners Society led by Sharon Kallis at Trillium Park and Maiwa School of Textiles, in Vancouver, BC.

In 2019, Fernanda launched her website and online store www.fernandamascarenhas.com to sell pieces dyed with plants. In 2020, she started the Plants and Colours blog to share her research on plants, natural dyeing and art. She started an English version in 2022.

In 2021, she was invited to present her work at the Eco Creative Cluster, an event at the Rockfield Centre, a community centre for art and culture in Oban, Scotland, UK. Inspired by her lecture, the Rockfield Centre created the Street Flora Tatakizome project, which breathes new life into street weeds through tatakizome, a simple natural dyeing technique.

Fernanda runs courses and workshops to teach natural dyeing techniques, such as Botanical Contact Printing, and organizes workshops related to the body, meditation and sensibility.
